## Tim Curtis

Tim Curtis is the Chief of the Culture Unit in UNESCO Bangkok office, and is responsible for the implementation of UNESCO's Culture Programme in South East Asia as well as for the coordination of UNESCO activities in culture in the broader Asia-Pacific region. He received his PhD in Cultural Anthropology from the Research School of Pacific and Asian Studies, where he wrote a thesis entitled on the relationship between oral history and place amongst the Na'hai speakers of Malakula in the Republic of Vanuatu. Prior to taking up his current position he worked as the Programme Specialist for Culture in Dar es Salaam, where he oversaw UNESCO programmes in Tanzania, Madagascar, Comoros, Mauritius and Seychelles. From 2000 until 2004 he consulted with UNESCO headquarters on programmes related to Intangible Cultural Heritage, Local and Indigenous Knowledge Systems as well as Small Island Developing States. Over the last 15 years, he has worked on numerous international programmes related to culture in the fields of heritage, cultural industries, cultural policies and culture and development.
